

A TIME OF REFLECTION

Let's conclude our review of the Old Testament prophets, shall we?

Nahum predicted the downfall of Nineveh approximately 100 years after Jonah. And whereas Jonah *wanted* Nineveh to be "judged" by God, Nineveh listened, repented of their behavior and changed their ways. But over the next century, Nineveh's wealth and power grew until the Babylonians Medes and Persians sacked the city. Part of Nahum's prophecy was to remind God's people that He loved them and had plans for their future.

Habakkuk: "*O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, / and you will not hear?*" (1:2 ESV) Habakkuk's great prayer is not so uncommon, is it? God speaks to the prophet and leads every reader to the answer for this great question.

Zephaniah "Zephaniah warns Israel and the surrounding nations that the Day of the Lord (End of Time) is near. God will judge the nations with a burning fire as he purifies them from sin, evil, and violence." Purified from sin, evil and violence – sounds like saving us by "*purifying*" us.

Haggai has several strong messages, but here's the big one. "*Is it a time for you yourselves to dwell in your paneled houses, while this house lies in ruins?*" (1:4 ESV) It's 520 BC and God is moving His people to faith and obedience, and to learn that God works in the gaps of discouragement. **Great Word!**

Zechariah is a contemporary of Haggai, and his prophecy matches his name: (*The Lord remembers.*) Along with Haggai and Ezra and Nehemiah, Zechariah encourages the people to put God's house, God's work, ahead of their own. God will bless their obedience. He does.

Malachi is known as "*the twelve*" of the minor prophets, Hosea – Malachi, "*TaNak*" (www.newworldencyclopedia.org/entry/TaNak). He speaks to Israel almost 100 years after they return from captivity. In the first two chapters Malachi (God) lays out three disputes with the people, and the people fight back. Disputes four, five and six appear in chapters 2–3, and chapter four contains the conclusion. God promises hope, which is the purpose of prophets.
