Halfway through another year, time for a philosophical question: What's it all mean? Don't say you haven't thought it; we all think it. So, they asked Him their big question: "Is this when You will reestablish Your Kingdom?"

Jesus sighed. Okay, it doesn't say, "He sighed", but He must have. It's got to be one of those unwritten emotions that drove His answer. What He said was, "It's not for you or any other man to know. That's for the Father to decide. And He'll let us know when He's ready." What an impossible response to their "big question".



Only God knows. The positive outcome for those of us who love and obey God is found in 1 Corinthians 13:12 (Amplified Bible):

For now, we are looking in a mirror that gives only a dim (blurred) reflection [of reality as in a riddle or enigma], but then [when perfection comes] we shall see in reality and face to face! Now I know in part (imperfectly), but then I shall know and understand fully and clearly, even in the same manner as I have been [c] fully and clearly known and understood [by God].
