### SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS

Why do we believe in what – or who – we cannot prove? *Scientifically, it makes no sense.* But we read books and watch movies with fictitious characters. And we get so absorbed that we wait for the next book or the next movie. Sometimes the scene is science fiction and we're carried away to the world of imagination. Sometimes the scene is normal life and we wait to see how the characters react to what happens in their lives. Sometimes the scenes are historic and we let the author play us through his or her view of how it all happened. That's why we loved Ruth and Naomi, Esther and Ahasuerus, or David and Jonathan, or Abraham and Sarah.

Humans love moving from the real to the imaginative. And sometimes the imaginative is compellingly real. But entertainment, as compelling as it is, is not belief. And when we go to church and worship with our friends, we cross a line. We're not just entertaining our souls; we're reaffirming our faith in the invisible. That which we cannot see has captured our hearts and minds. We're here to offer Him our praise and to be reminded that nothing is more important to us than His work in us and in our world.


But that is only part. We're reminding ourselves that when we pass from this life, we will be reunited with those who have gone before us. And that whatever God has planned for the next life will be incredible. Do we dare think about that? Why not? *Do we believe in what we cannot prove?* Hebrews 11:1; 1 John 3:2:

Now faith is the assurance (the confirmation, the title deed) of the things [we] hope for, being the proof of things, [we] do not see *and* the conviction of their reality [faith perceiving as real fact what is not revealed to the senses].

Beloved, we are [even here and] now God's children; it is not yet disclosed (made clear) what we shall be [hereafter], but we know that when He comes and is manifested, we shall [as God's children] resemble and be like Him, for we shall see Him just as He [really] is.

God is not <u>finished</u> with me yet. Ruth 4:13-17; 2:2, 5-14; 3:3-6 God connects Naomi's destiny with Ruth.

Don't let him <u>look</u> up and <u>see</u> anyone else.

The story doesn't end until God has made <u>provision</u> for your <u>redemption</u> Mark 10:47; Isaiah 59:19; Psalm 150:6

A woman who by her own admission was <u>dead</u>, by her own estimation had <u>nothing</u> to offer, was <u>connected</u> to a coming Christ who would be <u>born</u> in a manger in Bethlehem.

God is waking up a <u>remnant</u> that will not be <u>satisfied</u> with things the way they are.
